CMEP In the News

Churches for Middle East Peace: A Call to Action

Adding to the voices calling for peace is the group Churches for Middle East Peace (CMEP). They have called upon the US to refrain from interventions that could potentially worsen the situation. The group advocates for an immediate end to violence, urging all parties involved to exercise restraint. Highlighting the potential for a protracted military offensive and possible ground invasion into Gaza, they stressed the impact on civilians, particularly children.

The CMEP is also advocating for the resumption of essential services like power, water, and gas for the people of Gaza. They stress the need for the protection of access to humanitarian aid and are calling on the international community, including the US, to pursue alternative means to protect Israeli and Palestinian civilians. They believe that addressing the core issues of the conflict is vital to achieving long-term peace.

"As Israel and the world are in shock at the news of past days, grief, lament, and horror are appropriate responses to the violence that has occurred," said Rev. Mae Elise Cannon, executive director of Churches for Middle East Peace, an ecumenical coalition of Christian communions. "For Palestinians, many feel their own suffering and catastrophes, at the hands of a decades-long military occupation and encroaching settlement expansion and violence has long been ignored. Neither tragedy negates the other. If there is ever to be long-lasting and sustainable peace, the core causes of the conflict must be addressed and resolved."


"My faith is really the only thing that keeps me going," Cannon told CBS News.







Help us pursue peace

- CMEP is aiming to raise \$400,000 to accomplish many of the following goals:
 - Educate
 - \$30,000 = Pilgrimage to Peace tours of CMEP staff and Palestinian Christians
 - \$40,000 = Re-hire the Outreach Coordinator position
 - \$20,000 = Staff speaking tours at colleges, churches, and communities to further the reach of CMEP across the US
 - Elevate
 - \$50,000 = Palestinian voices: Hire a full-time And Still We Rise (ASWR) Coordinator
 - \$30,000 = Funding for expanded programming and scholarships for Palestinian women to attend the upcoming ASWR Summit in November 2024.
 - \$20,000 = Funding for staff to travel from the US to the Middle East (ME) and for travel throughout the ME region to work in person with our Middle East partners
 - \$50,000 = Re-hire the Manager of Middle East Partnerships in a full-time capacity
 - Advocate
 - \$70,000 = Re-hiring of the DC-based Mobilization Manager position, vacant since December 2022
 - \$50,000 = Re-hiring of the Communications Coordinator position, vacant since February 2023.
 - \$25,000 = Expand programming of the upcoming Advocacy Summit, April 9-11
 - \$15,000 = Website update and Congressional software
