

CMEP Echoes Patriarchs and Heads of Churches in Jerusalem on Armenian Patriarchate

Foreclosure Threat

September 30, 2025, Washington D.C.- Churches for Middle East Peace (CMEP) echoes the urgent call of the Patriarchs and Heads of the Churches in Jerusalem and stands in unwavering solidarity with the Armenian Patriarchate. This renewed foreclosure threat is not merely a legal dispute; it is a direct challenge to the centuries-old Status Quo that safeguards the presence and witness of Christian communities in the Holy Land. Targeting the Armenian Patriarchate with unjust and disproportionate financial burdens undermines the sustainability of the Church's ministry, weakens the fabric of Jerusalem's diverse religious life, and sets a dangerous precedent for all Christian institutions. We urge immediate intervention by Israeli authorities and international actors to halt these proceedings and engage in constructive dialogue that respects religious freedom, protects historic Christian rights, and upholds justice in the city that is sacred to Jews, Christians, and Muslims alike.

PATRIARCHS AND HEADS OF CHURCHES IN JERUSALEM RENEW THEIR CONDEMNATION OF UNJUST FORECLOSURE HEARING AGAINST ARMENIAN PATRIARCHATE, URGING IMMEDIATE INTERVENTION

Jerusalem – September 26, 2025

But let justice roll down like waters, and righteousness like an ever-flowing stream.

Amos 5:24

On February 19th of this year, We, the Patriarchs and Heads of the Churches in Jerusalem, issued a Statement of Solidarity with our beloved colleagues of the Orthodox Armenian Patriarchate in Jerusalem, who were at the time facing a hearing in the Israeli courts over an unjust foreclosure order issued by the Municipality of Jerusalem. As we then wrote, "the actions taken against the Armenian Patriarchate, based on an unverified and exorbitant Arnona Tax debt, are legally dubious and morally unacceptable."

Subsequently, this court hearing was cancelled, with the hope that dialogue on this matter would be initiated with the government to reach an equitable solution to this matter.

Regretfully, a new hearing date was scheduled for next Monday, 29 September, placing the threat of unjust foreclosure on property owned by the Armenian Patriarchate exactly where it was when we issued our Statement seven months ago.

In view of this recent development, we continue to stand united behind the Armenian Patriarchate in their call for "the authorities to engage in good faith negotiations" (*Communiqué*, 22 Sept. 2025).

We further join the Armenian Patriarchate in calling upon the offices of the Prime Minister and the Foreign Minister to intervene by urging the competent authorities to suspend the current legal proceedings and to ensure that any further deliberations on this matter are referred to the appropriate venues. Only by such a course, we believe, can the rights of the Armenian Patriarchate be duly safeguarded, together with those of all other Christian communities in the Holy Land.

<u>Sep 18, 2025: CMEP Statement on the Freezing of the Greek Orthodox Patriarchate of</u> Jerusalem's Bank Accounts

On August 6, 2025, the Jerusalem Municipality froze the bank accounts of the Greek Orthodox Patriarchate of Jerusalem. This action is deeply troubling, both in its immediate impact and in its broader implications. It constitutes a direct violation of the historic Status Quo that has governed Jerusalem for centuries and threatens the ability of the Churches to provide vital spiritual, educational, charitable, and social services to their communities.

<u>Sep 15, 2025: CMEP Condemns the Jerusalem attack by Hamas and the Israeli attack on Qatar as further escalations in the ongoing Israel/Hamas War</u>

Churches for Middle East Peace (CMEP) is appalled by the alarming escalation of violence across the Middle East over the past week in the ongoing battle between Israel and Hamas. Civilians pay the highest price. The violence must stop, and the ongoing killing must be brought to an end. The cycle of brutality continues to devastate lives, fueling greater insecurity and suffering for all.

<u>Sep 12, 2025: Joint Statement: "A Death Sentence" – Aid Agencies Warn of Israel's Assault on Gaza City</u>

45 Humanitarian and civil society organizations warn that Israel's assault on Gaza City amounts to a death sentence. Intensified Israeli military attacks on Gaza City and forced displacement orders for the entire city are leaving families with an impossible dilemma: flee and risk death on the road and in overcrowded displacement areas, or stay and face relentless bombardment in their shelters.

<u>Aug 27, 2025: Churches for Middle East Peace Elevates the Joint Statement by the Greek</u> Orthodox Patriarchate of Jerusalem and the Latin Patriarchate of Jerusalem

Churches for Middle East Peace affirms the joint statement from the Greek Orthodox and Latin Patriarchates of Jerusalem as a cry from the heart of the Christian community in the Holy Land, a prophetic voice of truth spoken amid unbearable suffering. Their words remind us that what is unfolding in Gaza is not an abstraction, but the lived reality of hundreds of thousands of men, women, and children, including the faithful who have sought refuge within the very walls of the Church. The Patriarchates' declaration that there can be "no future based on captivity, displacement of Palestinians or revenge" is both a moral compass and a summons to the global conscience.

<u>Aug 26, 2025 Joint Statement: The Latest Planned Israeli Military Offensive in Gaza City Must</u> Be Halted

Churches for Middle East Peace (CMEP) joined twenty church-based organizations in calling for Israel to halt its planned military offensive in Gaza City. With famine already declared in Gaza, further military operations will only cause further suffering and death for a civilian population without anywhere else to go. As the letter reads, "this displacement will result in a modern-day death march that is clearly intended to ethnically cleanse half of the Gaza Strip and compress all of Gaza's population into a tiny sliver of territory incapable of sustaining life." The letter calls on all parties, including the United States, to use all leverage available to call upon the Israeli government to reverse its plans for a military offensive in Gaza City and to instead pursue a durable and lasting ceasefire.
