We pray that the current tensions will be resolved peacefully and in a manner that strengthens the Armenian Church, honors its traditions, and promotes the flourishing and unity of the Armenian people. CMEP stands in prayer and solidarity with the Armenian Apostolic Church and the Armenian people during this difficult time.
